A Message From Mr Applegate

Attendance- Recently we sent out attendance letters with Gold, Green, Amber and Red colours. The idea was to inform parents what their child's attendance rate was, and categorise it accordingly. Unfortunately it does include genuine illness and if a child had been unwell for a week, this would put them into an amber category for example. We recognise that the system needs improving to be fairer to all, and we'll review it fully for next time. For your information, 97% is considered good attendance, and is the minimum of what we aim for all pupils where possible.

Parking update – On a positive note, the school held a meeting regarding how we as a school and community can develop a positive and consistent approach to road safety and parking. Ten people joined us, including a local councillor, county councillor, parents, and managers of Hatch Warren Community Centre and Dandelions. Our own Mrs Brackenridge represented our JRSOs. We are committed to a long term approach, changing culture and attitudes where needed. We recognised that it's often the few who make it dangerous, too. We had a positive meeting with several outcomes including:

- Improved signage for speed limits
- Joining the "Community Speed Camera Scheme"
- JRSOs raising awareness of road safety, and going out to confront parents and careers who deliberately park unsafely
- "Name and Shame" to carry on
- Various improvements to the Hatch Warren Community Centre to improve and enforce flow of traffic
