Reminders

Home Learning Logs - These should be coming into school and being taken home every day. Please make sure you are checking your child's Learning Log regularly and signing it on a Thursday.

Cycling - It is wonderful to see some of the year 6 children cycling to school; may we remind them that they must wear a helmet and that they are to dismount when they arrive in the school grounds as it is a busy period.

Uniform - The children are looking very smart but we are aware that many items of clothing are not named; please could you ensure all items are named to avoid them getting lost. PE kits should come into school on a Monday and be taken home on a Friday. It is essential that your child has named indoor and outdoor clothing.

School Bag - Your child's bag, PE kit and lunchbox needs to fit inside their cubby hole; we recommend that they bring a 'book bag' rather than a rucksack to ensure this

Reading Books - Your child should by now have brought home a reading book. Ideally, your child needs to be reading for 15 minutes most days.

Homework - Your child should record any homework tasks in their Learning Log.

We will start sending home Homework after Windmill Hill. Maths homework will go home on a Friday, to be handed in the following Friday and we will also be sending home SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) on a Wednesday which the children will also have a week to complete. Within some projects, we may also send home a piece of topic homework to complete over a longer period of time - the aim of this is to deepen the children's learning whilst also being fun and creative.

If there are any problems with completing any homework, please contact your child's class or Maths teacher before the due date. If homework is not handed in on the due date then the children miss out on the feedback session which impacts their learning.


