Topic & English

Throughout the first half of the term our topic 'Walk like an Egyptian' will enable children to focus on an ancient civilisation. This will be followed by our Geography topic 'Born and Bread'. Both topics will be closely linked with English with exciting opportunities for reading and writing. Children will also have discrete lessons for learning grammar, punctuation and spelling.

In Autumn 1, children will be undertaking a book study of the David McKee Mr Benn stories. They will write their own adventure stories where Mr Benn travels back in time to the Egyptian era to save the day. They will also be writing news reports from the discovery of Tutankhamun.

In Autumn 2, children will be advising Paddington Bear on all the best places to visit in the UK. They will write letters from him to his Aunt Lucy back in Darkest Peru. They will also be developing and writing their own recipes on how to make the best bread to make marmalade sandwiches.

<u>Science</u>

Our science this half term is all about electricity. Children will be learning about and building electrical circuits. They will begin to understand what electricity is and where it comes from. They will also further their understanding of how to keep safe with electricity. After half term, we will be exploring states of matter. Children will identify how changes occur between liquids, solids and gases and learn about the water cycle.

<u>PSHE</u>

We will be using the Heartsmart resources to explore the High Five Heartsmart principles. Children will have time to reflect on the importance of loving themselves and others through the underlying principle of what we put into our hearts will affect what we put our hearts into.

<u>Maths</u>

We will be covering the full range of mathematical skills across the term including number facts, calculation, geometry, decimals & fractions, measures and statistics. Our focus will be on securing the children's understanding of place value and using a range of apparatus to explain their reasoning.

Times Tables

Pupils should be taught to recall multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12 (The National Curriculum)

Please support your child to recall their times tables, working towards the St Mark's challenges. Look out for our relaunch of 'Times Table Rockstars' which will reflect this year's classes.

<u>PE</u>

In games, the children will be exploring throwing, catching and dodging as skills for netball. After half term, the games session focus will be skills for hockey.

In dance, children will be learning how to 'Walk Like an Egyptian' and taking inspiration to create their own dance routines.

In gym, we will be using mats to create sequences involving balancing, rolling and jumping.

<u>Music</u>

In music, children will be learning about different phrases in a song, gaining an understanding of pitch and melody and also be singing a variety of songs. They will be listening to music from around the UK and will have the opportunity to perform with a variety of percussion instruments.

French

In French this term, children will develop their knowledge of numbers in French. They will also be learning the days of the week and they will work in pairs to have conversations.

practical, involving lots of games and partner work.

In DT, we will be designing and making our own bread. We will develop and write a recipe for it.

Computing

In Autumn 1, the children will be learning how to store files and create folders. They will be reminded of key esafety principles and sign the St Mark's computing charter. During Autumn 2, the focus will be on using different technology to research efficiently. Children will be encouraged to read information objectively and to consider its validity.
