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

It's a simple strategy we are using in many year groups to support children's ability to explain their answers to questions more fully. It applies across all subjects, and aims to reduce basic answers or 'just because!' answers to questions. See the APE diagram in this newsletter. You can make use of this by asking your children to 'APE' their answer when you ask them a question!

It's been great to hear several parents say that Boris' High Five (HeartSmart) statements are also helping at home. They really are good principles, and when home and school share a common language, it becomes even more powerful. Visit heartsmartprimary.com to find out more.
