Green Cross Code

When crossing roads follow these simple steps:





Always find a safer place to cross, then stop.

- Stand on the pavement, but not too close to the edge of the kerb.
- Look and listen in all directions for any traffic.

Cross when there is no traffic and there is **enough time** to get to the other side. If you are not sure, don't cross.

Keep looking and listening for traffic as you cross.

Walk straight across the road. Do not run.
