EDUCATION THROUGH SPORT

School Meals – Sept Price Increase

We have been advised by Hampshire County Council that the cost of a school meal will increase to £2.40 per meal as of September 2019. Please can we remind you that payment for school meals should be made in advance or on the day the meal is taken.

Our preferred method of payment is via the online Scopay system; alternatively you can pay by cash or cheque at the school office. Universal Infant Free School Meals are currently for children in Years R to 2. Once your child reaches Year 3 you will then be required to pay for meals. This has always been the case across all schools.
