Please note the School Office can only administer medicine if it has been prescribed by a GP and has your child's name on the dispensing label. There is a form you will need to complete to enable the medicine to be administered during the school day, which can be obtained from the school office. We are unable to administer generic ibuprofen and paracetamol without a prescription, but you are welcome to come into the school to administer this medicine yourself should your child need it.

Lunchtime Supervisory Assistant Required


We are looking for a friendly, reliable and enthusiastic person to join our lunchtime team.
