Each day you can continue to **read** your school books, or books you have at home. If you are running out of reading material, a good website to look at for reading scheme books is www.oxfordowl.co.uk

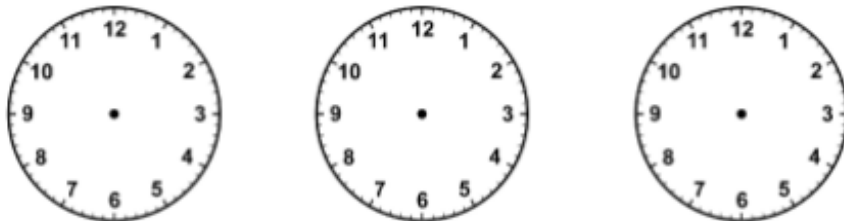

Tasks for Tuesday 17th March 2020

Maths: Time – this work continues with the learning we have been doing in class. The children are becoming secure with o'clock and half past times, drawing the hands on the clock face and writing the time in words. We have also been exploring telling the time to quarter to and quarter past the hour. Practicing telling the time throughout the day will support your child in securing their understanding.

Can the children make a timeline of their day. They must include a picture to show what they are doing, drawing the hands on the clock face and writing a sentence to support. For example, I get up at 7 o'clock. Use the sheet provided if you need to, or perhaps draw the clock face for your child.



English: Handwriting - Please encourage your children to continue the practice of all upper and lower case letters using the correct lead in and outs. Please use the sheet below to help practice the spelling and handwriting of some of our Year 2 common exception words. This will help model some of the specific joins that we use in school handwriting.

Hidden Words

Draw and color a picture. Hide your spelling words inside your picture.

Show your picture to someone and see if they can find your hidden words!

Backwards Words

Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. Write neatly!
