How many A's did you circle?A's stand for physical touch. People whose love language is physical touch like to receive hugs, kisses, and high-fives.
How many B's did you circle? B's stand for words of affirmation. People whose love language is words of affirmation like for others to use words to tell them that they are special and that they do a good job.
How many C's did you circle? C's stand for gifts. People with the love language of gifts feel good when someone gives them a special present or surprise to show they are thinking of them.
How many D's did you circle? D's stand for acts of service. A person whose love language is acts of service likes it when others do nice things for them such as helping with chores, helping with school projects, or driving them places.
How many E's did you circle? E's stand for quality time. People with the love language of quality time like it when others do things with them like play a game, watch television, or go on an outing.
Look at your scores. The highest score represents your primary love language - how you most like to receive love. This doesn't mean the others aren't important, it just means that this is your favourite.
