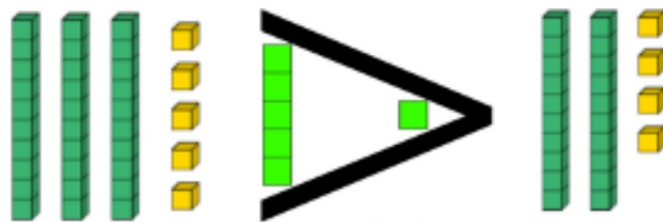


Have a go at finding some objects and deciding which group is greater, less than or equal to. You could draw some symbols and put them in the middle. See if you can say a sentence about it too. For example:



'35 cars is greater than 24 buttons.'

Represent each group using tens and ones on some paper.
What can you say about it? For example:



Here are some example sentences you might say:

35 cars is represented by 3 tens and 5 ones.

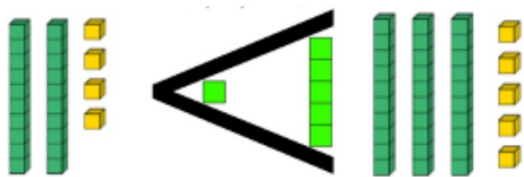
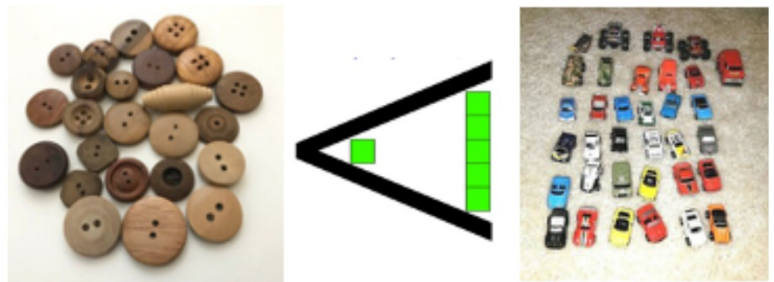
24 buttons is represented by 2 tens and 4 ones.

35 is greater than 24 because there are more cars than buttons.

35 has more tens than 24.

35 has more ones than 24.

If you know that there are more cars than buttons, you can swap it over like this:



'24 buttons is less than 35 cars.'

Here are some example sentences you might say:

35 cars is represented by 3 tens and 5 ones.

24 buttons is represented by 2 tens and 4 ones.

24 is less than 35 because there are more cars than buttons.

24 has less tens than 35.

24 has less ones than 35.
