I can use a range of conjunctions in a sentence.

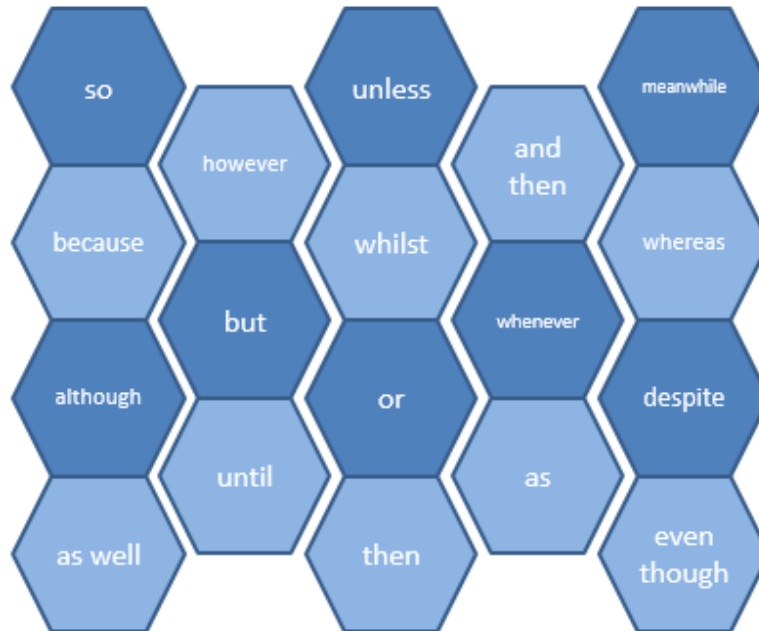
Use the Blockbusters game to come up with a variety of sentences about fairgrounds.

For some of the conjunctions these can go at the start of the sentence, but you will need to put a comma at the end of the clause.

## Conjunction BLOCKBUSTERS

1. Start from the left of the board and try to use any of the connectives in the first column. Write down the sentence that you have made.

2. If you use it correctly, move to a conjunction in the next column.



4. The aim of the game is to move all the way across the board.

3. If you use a conjunction incorrectly then you can no longer use this word and must find an alternative route across the board.

Use the picture to help you.

Examples of using conjunctions in a sentence might be:

The children cheered **because** they managed to hook a duck.

The man was enjoying the shooting gallery, **however** the pick pocket was stealing his wallet.

**Whilst** the man took his shot at the shooting gallery, the pick pocket stole his wallet.

**Although** they were screaming, the children were really enjoying the ride.
