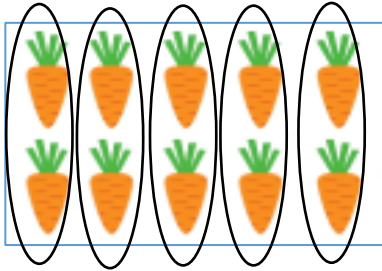


I can make equal groups of 2, 5 and 10.

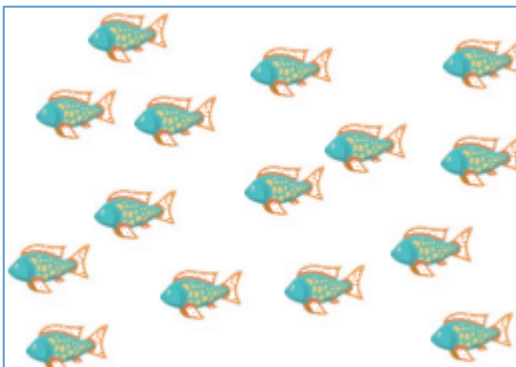

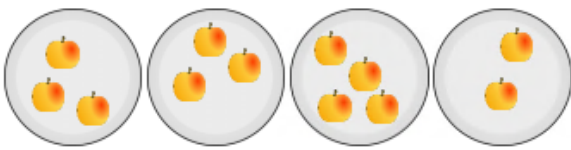

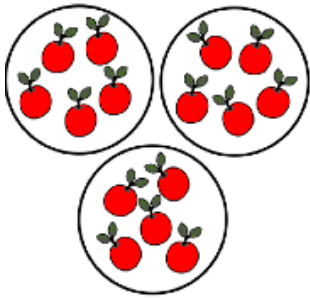
