I can use compound sentences

Today we will be using compound sentences to show the characteristics of villains and heroes through what they say to each other.

- Use conjunctions to create compound sentences

Remember a compound sentence is a sentence where two separate sentences are joined with the conjunctions 'and, but, or'.

Each part of the sentence needs to make sense on its own.

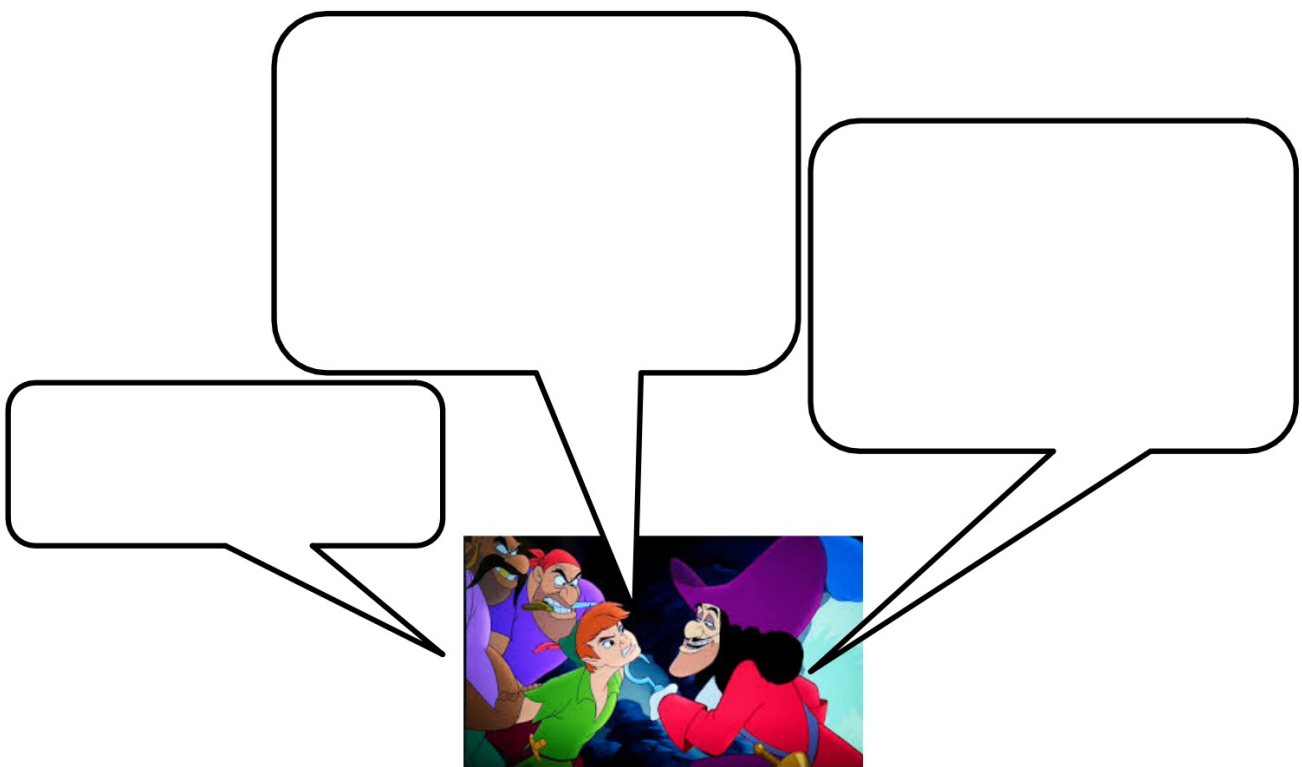
