Our aims in using our sports funding this year are as follows:

- 1. Provide staff with high quality planning to support the development of the quality of teaching.
- 2. Develop a clear skills-progression throughout the school.
- 3. Develop the skills of our new PE leadership team.
- 4. Promote being physically active at play times.
- 5. Enable a wide provision of after-school sports clubs to be offered and continue participation in a range of inter school competitions.
- 6. Increase lunchtime sports provision.
