As the children become more confident to read by sight our focus moves to fluency, expression and comprehension. Please encourage your child to read each sentence back, look for speech marks as an indicator that they can use an expressive voice, and ask them questions about what they've read.

Please continue to practise your child's words, particularly any red words, as often as you can.

The children are making good progress in their phonics lessons, developing independence and confidence to use the phonic sounds they know to read sentences more fluently and write words within short sentences independently. We continue to focus on building the children's sight recognition of both red and green words.

We are getting excited about our trip to Bucklebury Farm Park on Thursday 23rd June! More information to come nearer the time.

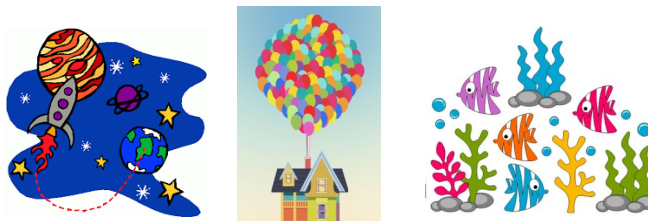
Sports Day— Friday 10th June

Maths



We shall spend the first week of this half term finishing our Numberblocks journey, meeting 19 and 20.

After this we shall spend the rest of the term working on developing the children's understanding of addition and subtraction within 10, introducing strategies such as 'counting on' and 'counting back' to find the answer.

We will also work more on the children's understanding of doubling, halving and sharing and how using these strategies can help the children solve problems.

RE
