Year 1	<ul> <li>PE days will be Monday and Thursday this week.</li> <li>Library is now on a Thursday.</li> <li>In English we will continue to build sentences linked to "The Great Explorer", leading to independent story writing.</li> <li>In maths we will use a range of strategies to support our learning of addition and subtraction facts.</li> <li>In RE we are learning about the Christmas story.</li> <li>In geography we will look more closely at the continent of Antarctica and the animals that live there.</li> </ul>	1. Year 2	<ul> <li>In maths we will be finishing up our adding and subtracting multiples of 10. For example: 34 + 30. We will begin to look at adding two 2-digit numbers. Year 3	<ul> <li>During maths this week, we will be continuing to add and subtract 3 digit numbers where an exchange is needed. We will also be thinking about complements to 100 e.g. ? + 33 = 100.</li> <li>In English, we continue to read and write about the Iron Man. We are focussing on using compound and complex sentences to make our writing more exciting and descriptive.</li> <li>In Science, we will be looking at magnets and thinking about how how poles attract and repel.</li> </ul>	1. Year 4	<ul> <li>During our bookclub sessions this week we will be starting a new text 'Rivers of the world.'
