In Maths this term, we will focus on fractions and decimals. Children will build on their Year 3 knowledge to extend their understanding of tenths and Children will explore thousandths. equivalent fractions as well as calculating with fractions. They will continue to consolidate their written calculation strategies. Children will continue to make regular use of TTRockstars to develop their rapid recall of facts.

Our <u>**RE**</u> topic will explore the concept of salvation within the Christian religion. Children will make links with the school play to their <u>RE</u> learning. They will develop their knowledge and understanding of the key events of Holy Week as well as considering rituals that are important to them.

The Best is yet to Come All of Year 4 will take part in our Easter production. There will be a number of roles including: singing, dancing, speaking, stage management and audio-visual. Children will develop their speaking and listening skills through communicating with their peers in which ever role they are taking part in. Please look out for a costume letter soon.



This term, Year 4 will explore the big question, 'Who should I follow?'

Through our **<u>English</u>**, we will be reading 'The Boy who Swam with Piranhas'. This text will drive our English learning this term and the children will develop their understanding of characters, settings and plot.

Children will write diary entries, character descriptions and persuasive letters throughout the unit of work.

Children will continue to be encouraged to read a wide range of texts and develop their skills to infer information from what they have read.

<u>PE</u>

PE this term will focus on the skills involved in tri-golf. This will include putting and chipping as well as skills for life including: honesty, safety and co-operation.
