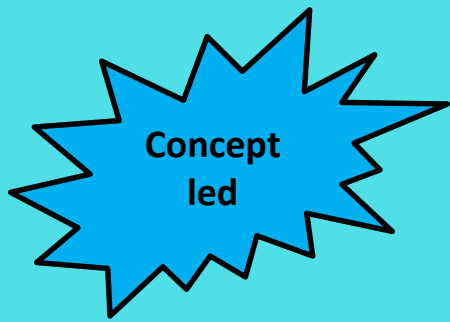

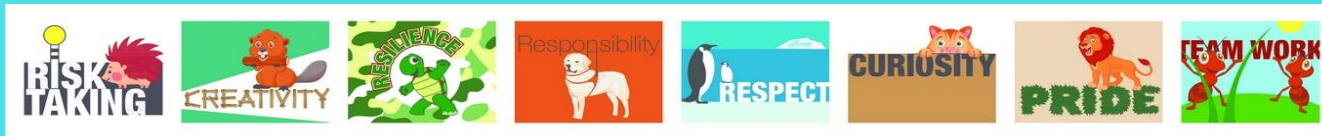

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Read at least 4 times a week and record in the reading log book.

## Reading Expectations

No bug club but those on RWI can use Oxford Owl.

ORT book is a sharing book and will be changed weekly.

RWI book to be read independently as phonetically decodable.

Read key words by sight.



Write sentences using finger spaces.

Starting to use full stops and capital letters.

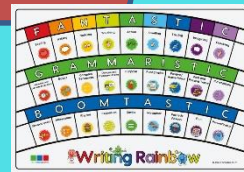
Spell common exception words and high frequency words.

Use phonics to spell words.

# Writing Expectations

Writing everyday.

The Write Stuff



Form letters correctly both upper and lower case.

Practising writing their name, with letters the correct way around.

Write full sentences independently.



# Home learning

Read with your child regularly and complete the log book.

Practise writing letters, numbers, their name and simple sentences.

Google Classrooms for home learning.

Practise key words sent home.

Use Spelling Shed to practise spellings.

Practise number fluency using Numbots.
