


The pupil can:

• read most words without blending, and sufficiently fluently to allow them to focus on their understanding rather than on decoding individual words.


In a book that they can read fluently, the pupil can:

- check it makes sense to them, correcting any inaccurate reading
- answer questions and make some inferences
- explain what has happened so far in what they have read.



Reading at School

"Reading aloud with children is known to be the single most important activity for building the knowledge and skills they will eventually require for learning to read."




Reading at home

Children who are developing their phonic knowledge will have RWI book to read at home. It will be matched to your child's phonic ability allowing them to practise sounds they have been taught. They can read this to you independently. Any additional books may be shared with your child. Oxford Owl is available while following the RWI programme.



Children should be encouraged to read each book three times - once to decode, once to develop fluency and once for comprehension.





Once they have completed RWI they will bring home an ORT book matched to their reading ability.

Try to read 4 times each week and record this in the reading log. Children meeting this target will earn a raffle ticket for an end of half term draw.




YEAR 2 WRITING EXPECTATIONS

Writing coherently for a range of purposes



- Accurate spelling- key words, spelling rules and then phonetically plausible for trickier words
- Accurate punctuation- capital letters and full stops






















THE WRITE STUFF

- Heavily focused on modelling
- Widens vocabulary
- Develops writing for purpose and awareness of the reader
- Develops planning and editing skills





SPELLING

- Linked to The Write Stuff
- Much more investigative
- We won't have a weekly spelling test
- Children will have exposure to different spellings and will be encouraged to identify the patterns or the tricky part of each spelling





HOW CAN YOU HELP YOUR CHILD WITH WRITING?

- Read every day (This supports vocabulary, spelling and writing!)
- Explore spelling- spot patterns as you read and write
- Encourage them to take pride in their writing
- Correct children with key word spellings and encourage them to use their phonic knowledge



YEAR 2 MATHS EXPECTATIONS

Core skills include:

- To be confident to add and subtract numbers
 within 100
- To know 2, 5 and 10 times tables and related division facts
- To apply their knowledge to problems and use reasoning

















HOW CAN YOU HELP YOUR CHILD WITH MATHS?

- Count everyday (in ones, twos, fives, and tensforwards and backwards)
- Practise number bonds to 10, 20 and 100
- Practise 2, 5 and 10 times tables

(Learn to tell the time- to the nearest quarter hour)

HOMEWORK

Reading challenge

- -At least 4 nights per week but most nights would be great!
- Don't forget to record in the reading logs!

Maths

- Counting (most nights)
- Numbots and TTRockstars (Spring term)
