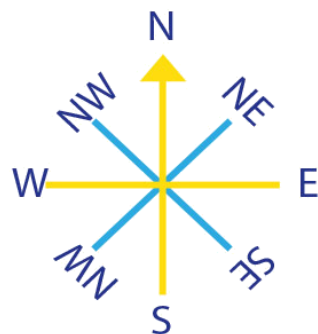


Geography - Simba's UK Road Trip - Year 4 - Spring 2 - What are the differences between the different regions of the UK?



Vocabulary Top Ten:

Landmarks	A feature of an area that is easily recognised from a distance.
Human Features	A feature or landmark of Geography that has been man made.
Physical Features	A feature or landmark of Geography that is natural.
Europe	The continent which the UK is on.
Country	A nation with its own government
County	A small part of a country, that has it's own council.
Equator	An imaginary line drawn across the centre of the world equidistant from both poles.
Northern Hemisphere	The northern half of the world, as decided by the equator.
Southern Hemisphere	The southern half of the world, as decided by the equator.
Route	A way taken in getting from a starting point to a destination.



Key Facts:

The UK is made up of 4 countries: England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

The British Isles includes Ireland, England, Northern England, Scotland and Wales.

Great Britain is England, Scotland and Wales

There are 48 counties in the UK (49 if you include the City of London!)

Basingstoke is located in the county of Hampshire, which is in the South-East of England

The oceans and seas that surround the UK are: the Atlantic Ocean, the North Sea, the Irish Sea, the English Channel and the Celtic Sea,

The capital city of England is London, of Wales it is Cardiff, of Scotland it is Edinburgh and of Northern Ireland it is Belfast.

The eight point of the compass are: North, North East, East, South East, South, South West, West, North West.
