In <u>Maths</u> this half term, after finishing off our statistics unit, we will begin our shape unit focusing on classifying, estimating and measuring angles. This unit also involves calculating angles and lengths in shapes, then angles around a point and on a straight line. We will then move on to studying position and direction, which includes coordinates, symmetry and reflection.

In <u>History</u>, we will be learning about the different experiences of black people living in Britain over time. We will begin during the Roman Empire as black Roman soldiers began to settle in Britain, travel to the Tudor era, look at the rise of the slave trade & the key figures, who acted for the abolition of slavery. Finally, we will explore the impact of Empire Windrush and the experiences of black people living in Britain over the changing landscape of the last 60 years.

Our **<u>D&T</u> unit** this half term is textiles where the children will create a stuffed toy using blanket stitch.

The <u>HeartSmart</u> theme for this half term is 'Fake Is A Mistake' as the children consider the importance of telling the truth to others and also being true to themselves. The children will also be learning about Anti-Social Behaviour this half term in their PSHE lessons.

Our <u>Computing</u> unit will involve making music using the program 'Scratch'. Children will 'tinker' with the software before composing a piece of music to accompany a scene from Pirates of the Caribbean.

In <u>Art</u>, the children will be learning about the work of Vanley Burke — a British Jamaican photographer whose work captured his community's arrival in Britain. The children will then use the art of photography to design their own arrival in Year 5 and their favourite memories from the year.

In <u>English</u> this half term, Year 5 will be completing a newspaper article linked to the arrival of the ship HMT Empire Windrush, which docked in Tilbury on 22nd June 1948. The ship brought many workers to the UK from different Caribbean countries to help to fill post-war labour shortages — the Windrush generation. Alongside this, we will read different texts to enhance the children's knowledge on this historical event. In addition, we will continue to implement many skills and techniques from the 'Writing Rainbow'. During the last few weeks of this half-term, we hope to produce some creative poetry linked to the Caribbean.

In **Science**, the children will be learning all about Living Things and their Habitats. We will start the unit by exploring and describing the life processes of reproduction in some plants. The children will have the opportunity to dissect a lily, look at the male and female parts of the flower and then use microscopes to look at these parts in more detail. The children will explore sexual and asexual reproduction in flowers, and use scientific diagrams to label the parts of a flower. Using drama, the children will act out the pollination process and then plan an enquiry into what affects how long pollinators spend at flowers.

<u>Music</u> this half term will involve listening to Blues music and learning about the origins of this.

We can't wait to learn more <u>French</u> this half term. The children will be learning how to say and write the names for different items of clothing.
