Key Facts

President John F. Kennedy wanted to put a man on the moon.

Apollo 11 was the name of the mission that landed on the Moon in July 1969.

The rocket was called Saturn V.

The Eagle was the part of the spacecraft that landed on the moon.

The first person to walk on the Moon was Neil Armstrong.

The other astronauts on the mission were Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins.

As Neil Armstrong stepped onto the Moon, he said, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

It took 76 hours to reach the moon.

Only 12 people have ever walked on the Moon.

1930 Born in Ohio, USA on the 5th August.	1937 Armstrong takes his first plane ride aged 6.	1946 He earns his pilot's licence at the age of 16.	1947 Goes to university in Indiana.	1949 Armstrong joins the US Navy.	1952 He starts working for NASA.	1962 Armstrong joins the astronaut programme.	1966 Armstrong takes his first flight to space on board Gemini 8.	1969 Armstrong becomes the first man to walk on the moon.	2012 Armstrong dies at the age of 82.
