

Maths

Through Maths, we will practise our counting within 20, both forwards and backwards and become confident at reading and writing these numbers correctly. We will learn about ways of making our numbers within 10 and use different resources and pictures to help us solve problems.

RE

In our RE learning this term, we will think about rules and explore how rules are part of the customs and beliefs of different faiths.

PE

This half term, we will enjoy a Forest School session as well as an outdoor PE session. During the outside PE time, we will explore the fundamental skills of balancing, running, changing direction, jumping, hopping, and skipping.

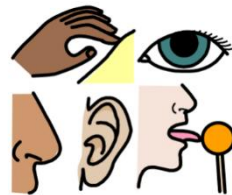
Computing

Through Computing, we will learn how to use a computer safely, turning it on and off correctly and logging on and off. We will also learn to use the keyboard to type simple words.

Science

In Science this term, we will think about humans and their senses. We will identify different parts of the body and find out how our senses link to these.

PSHE / Heartsmart

During our PSHE this term, we will explore the idea of teamwork and how we can work alongside each other. We will create our class charters and explore how rules are used to help us in our learning. We will also continue our work with Boris the Robot in Heartsmart.



Art

In Art, we will explore the use of colour through painting. We will learn about primary and secondary colours and how to mix colours. We will use our knowledge of colour-mixing to create paintings inspired by Matisse and Kandinsky.

Music

In Music, we will enjoy exploring and experimenting with pulse and rhythm using voices and percussion.

English

In English this term, we will explore familiar stories, including 'The Hungry Caterpillar' and 'The Enormous Turnip,' where we will talk about the texts and learn to retell them in simple words and sentences. We will also look at poetry and use our senses to inspire us to write our own poems about St Mark's.

Reading

Reading happens daily within our Little Wandle phonics sessions. Additionally, children will read with classroom adults across the week. Please can you read frequently with your child at home as it really does help them to grow in confidence. Four reads a week earn a raffle ticket for the half termly book prize.
